

## CHAPTER 46

# FEES

### SECTION 4601 GENERAL

**4601.1 General.** Fees for plan reviews, appeals to the Fire Safety Advisory Board, fire watch personnel, construction and operating permits, annual assessments, certificates and inspections shall be in accordance with this chapter.

**4601.2 Maintenance and repairs.** The maintenance or repair of a required system, feature or component does not require a fee.

**4601.3 Modifications – Fire protection systems.** A modification that increases the area protected by a fire protection system by 50 percent or more shall be considered a new installation. If the value of the work exceeds 50 percent of the replacement cost of the system, the fee for a new installation shall apply.

**4601.3.1 Modification with plan review.** This shall include automatic sprinkler systems, foam-water systems and other special systems. Sprinkler system modifications resulting from tenant improvements of shell buildings and remodeling of existing buildings shall be included in this category. The fees shall be assessed in accordance with Table 4601.3.1.

**Note:** Any requirement for new riser(s) or underground fire line shall be considered a new installation.

Modifications not requiring a change or addition of sprinkler heads shall be assessed a construction permit fee of \$300.

Modifications not requiring a change or addition of sprinkler heads include, but are not limited to:

1. Adding reinforcing mains to an existing system in order to increase the available delivered density.
2. Rerouting piping to accommodate other building changes, such as duct or structural elements.
3. Changing the size of the system riser to increase the delivered discharge density.

**4601.4 Permit time extensions.** 50 percent of the current permit fee.

**4601.5 Permit reinstate after expiration.** 100 percent of the current fee.

**4601.6 Investigations fee.** When the fire code official determines that construction was completed and the required fees were not paid, an additional fee equal to the cost of the required construction permit fee shall be assessed for the work.

**4601.7 Over the counter permits.** Over the counter permits shall be assessed fees in accordance with Table 4601.7.

**4601.8 Removal permit.** A fire protection system removal permit fee is not charged at this time.

### SECTION 4602 PLAN REVIEW FEES

**4602.1 Plan submittal deposit fee.** A \$200.00 fee shall be paid at the time of plan submittal. The deposit fee entitles the submitting individual to an initial plan review and a second plan review for any errors or deficiencies in the submittal package. The deposit fee is subtracted from the construction permit fee when the plans are approved or approved with comments.

**Note:** The deposit will not be refunded if the submitter does not follow through and obtain a permit.

**4602.2 Second review fee.** No fee is charged for second plan review when the only changes made to the construction plans are those noted in the first plan review.

**4602.2.1 Revisions to approved plans.** If the second plan review reveals that changes to the original design occurred, a \$150 fee or the modification fee for the particular system, whichever is greater, shall be assessed.

**4602.3 Third review fee.** If the construction permit drawings cannot be approved or approved as noted after the first and second plan review, fees shall be in accordance with Section 4602.1.

**4602.4 Expedited plan review fee.** When allowed by the fire code official, a plan review may be expedited. The permit applicant shall pay a minimum fee of \$310.50. This fee allows for 3 hours of plan review. If the time required to perform the plan review exceeds 3 hours, an additional fee of \$103.50 shall be assessed for each additional hour or portion thereof.

**4602.5 Technical report review fee.** A technical report review fee shall be assessed at \$750.00 for the first review. Second and subsequent reviews shall be assessed at \$375.00 each.

**4603.1 Appeals to the Fire Marshal.** A fee is not charged at this time.

**4602.6 Appeals to the Fire Safety Advisory Board.** For all occupancies an administrative fee of \$50 shall be assessed for an appeal to the Fire Safety Advisory Board. For single-family residences an administrative fee of \$25.00 shall be assessed for an Appeal to the Fire Safety Advisory Board.

**4602.7 Life safety report.** No fee is charged at this time.

**SECTION 4603  
INSPECTION FEES**

**4603.1 New construction.** Inspection fees for new construction are included in the permit fee at this time.

**4603.2 Re-inspection-new construction.** Permit fees provide for customary inspections only. A re-inspection fee may be assessed for each inspection or re-inspection when such portion of work for which inspection is called is not complete or when corrections called for are not made. Re-inspection fees may be assessed when the permit is not posted or otherwise available on the work site, the approved plans are not readily available to the inspector, for failure to provide access on the date for which inspection is requested, or for deviating from plans requiring the approval of the fire code official.

**4603.3 After hours inspections fees (3 hour minimum).** After hours inspection can be requested for a minimum 3 hour charge. The fee shall be \$103.50 per hour.

**SECTION 4604  
FIRE WATCH FEES**

**4604.1 General.** When Fire Department personnel are required by this code to stand fire watch, the individual required to provide such service shall pay a minimum fee of \$103.50 per person, 3 hours minimum. If the time period exceeds 3 hours, an additional fee of \$103.50 shall be paid for each hour, or portion thereof, for each person assigned.

**SECTION 4605  
CONSTRUCTION PERMIT FEES**

When required, construction permit fees shall be in accordance with this section.

**4605.1 Access gates.** A construction permit of \$100 for a manual gate and \$300 for an automatic gate shall be assessed to install, or modify manual or automatic fire apparatus access gates and their appurtenances. This also includes gates for auxiliary access openings.

**4605.2 Address directories.** No fee is charged at this time.

**4605.3 Fire apparatus access road.** No fee is charged at this time.

**4605.3.1 Alternative surface fire apparatus access road.** A construction permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to install or modify each alternative surface fire apparatus access road at a given address.

**4605.4 Automatic hood systems, commercial.** A construction permit fee of \$200 shall be assessed to install or modify fire suppression systems installed above commercial cooking equipment.

**Note:** When required, the connection to the building fire alarm or monitoring system will be charged as a separate fire alarm system fee.

**4605.5 Battery systems.** A construction permit fee of \$370 shall be assessed for plan review and inspection of stationary lead acid or valve-regulated lead acid battery system.

**4605.6 Compressed gas systems.** A construction permit fee of \$400 shall be assessed for a compressed, liquefied compressed or dissolved gas system. Each individual gas constitutes a separate system and shall be assessed the construction permit fee.

**4605.7 Cryogenic fluid systems.** A construction permit fee of \$400 shall be assessed for a cryogenic fluid system. Each individual pressure vessel constitutes a separate system and shall be assessed the construction permit fee. A cryogenic fluid system shall also be subject to a hazardous materials permit assessment fee. See section 4607.1.

**4605.8 Firefighter breathing air systems.** A construction permit fee of \$875 shall be assessed for a firefighter breathing air system. A modification to a firefighter breathing air system shall be assessed a fee of \$400.

**4605.9 Fire alarm and detection systems and related equipment.** A construction permit is required for installation of or

modification to fire alarm and detection systems and related equipment. Maintenance performed in accordance with this code is not considered a modification and does not require a permit. See Table 4605.10.

**4605.10 Fire Protection Systems.** A construction permit is required for installation of or modification to fire protection systems. Maintenance performed in accordance with this code is not considered a modification and does not require a permit. See Table 4605.11.

**4605.11 Fire Pumps and Related Equipment.** A construction permit is required for installation of or modification to all UL or FM fire pumps, jockey pumps and controllers. The fee shall be \$600. Maintenance performed in accordance with this code is not considered a modification and does not require a permit.

**Note:** Where required, a separate permit shall be obtained for supervisory off-premise fire alarm transmitters.

**4605.12 Flammable and combustible liquids.** A construction permit is required to:

**4605.13 Flammable finishes.** A construction permit is required to install or modify a spray booth, spray room, spray area, or powder coating booth. The fee shall be \$575. The fee for modifications is \$225.

**Note:** The fee includes the plan review fee for the fire protection system if it is submitted with the spray booth, spray room or spray area plan.

**4605.14 Halon, dry chemical, carbon dioxide extinguishing systems, FM 200, and other special extinguishing systems.** A construction permit is required for installation or modification:

Footage	Construction Permit Fee
≥ 5,000 square feet	\$550
Each additional 5,000 square feet or fraction thereof,	\$100

**Note:** Where protection is provided at multiple levels within a room, the square footage of the largest area protected shall be used to calculate the size of the project. For example, if a room or area has a raised floor and the area beneath the floor is protected by the same system, the project size will be based on the square footage of either the room floor or the areas protected below the floor, whichever is greater.

**4605.15 Hazardous materials.** A construction permit shall be required in accordance with Table 4605.16.

**Exceptions:**

1. Routine maintenance.

**4605.16 High piled combustible storage and high challenge commodity sprinkler systems.** Construction permit fees for fire protection plan review fee for automatic sprinkler systems designed to protect high-piled combustible storage and high challenge commodities shall be calculated using the following fee schedule:

Each ceiling sprinkler system design area	\$207
Each in-rack sprinkler system design area	\$207
for each fire pump	\$276
for each static water tank	\$276
for each high challenge commodity (exception: Group A plastics)	\$207
for each fire test report used as a basis for the design	\$414
for an incomplete plans submittal	\$200

A plan review fee shall be charged for each review. Plan review fees are independent and separate of the sprinkler construction inspection fees.

**4605.17 Knox key box.** As per manufacturer.

**4605.18 LP-gas.** A construction permit is required to:

1. Install, alter or modify an LP-gas system. The fee shall be \$175.
2. Install, alter or modify LP-gas containers with an aggregate water capacity of 125 gallons (473L) or more used exclusively for vapor service. The fee shall be \$175.
  - 2.1 Systems with fixed fire protection equipment add: \$300.
3. Install, move, relocate, alter or modify racks storing 20-pound cylinders for the purpose of conducting an LP-gas exchange program at a specific site. The fee shall be \$100.
4. Install, alter or modify LP-gas containers used for liquid transfer service. The fee shall be \$100.

**Exception:** A permit is not required to install, alter or modify portable containers of less than 125 gallon aggregate water capacity used exclusively for vapor service.

**4605.19 Private fire hydrants.** A construction permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed for the installation, alteration or modification of each private fire hydrant.

**4605.20 Refrigeration system, anhydrous ammonia.** A construction permit fee of \$225 for each container or tank is assessed to install, alter or modify an anhydrous ammonia refrigeration system.

**4605.21 Smoke and heat vents.** No fee is charged at this time.

**4605.22 Smoke removal systems.** No fee is charged at this time.

**4605.23 Special extinguishing systems.** A construction permit is required to install, alter or modify special extinguishing systems, including but not limited to, Halon, dry chemical, carbon dioxide, FM200 see Table 4605.15.

**4605.24 Standpipe systems.** A construction permit is required for the installation, modification or removal from service of a standpipe system. Maintenance performed in accordance with this code is not considered a modification and does not require a permit. The fee shall be 1–4 fire department hose connections \$300. Each additional 1–4 department hose connections add \$200.

**4605.25 Tank installation, aboveground.** A construction permit is required to install aboveground tanks. This shall include all flammable/combustible liquid tanks installed aboveground including tanks in vaults, and any required piping, valves and dispensing equipment. The fee shall be \$450 for each tank. Tanks with fixed fire protection systems add \$600.

**4605.26 Tank installation, underground.** A construction permit is required to install underground tanks. This shall include all flammable/combustible liquid tanks installed underground and any required piping, valves and dispensing equipment. The fee shall be \$250 for each tank.

**4605.27 Tank removal.** A construction fee of \$225 shall be assessed for tank removal. The inerting shall be included in removal fee.

**4605.28 Temporary membrane structures and tents.** A construction permit fee of \$325 shall be assessed to erect a temporary membrane structure, or a tent having an area in excess of 800 square feet. Each additional tent or membrane structure \$150.

**Exceptions:**

1. Tents used exclusively for recreational camping.
2. Tents and curtains or extensions attached thereto, when used for funeral services.

**4605.29 Underground fire lines.** A construction permit is required to install or modify underground fire lines that serve fire protection systems, fire hydrants or any combination thereof. The fee shall be \$375 for each connection to a city water main including up to 500 lineal feet of pipe. Each additional 500 feet or fraction thereof add \$200, each fire protection system lead-in add \$130.

**4605.30 Underground fire line, stub-out only (over the counter permit):** Stub-outs which are installed and tested as part of the underground fire line are included in the fire protection system lead-in charge. When permitted separately from the building's underground fire line, a separate over-the-counter permit is required for each stub-out. Stub-outs shall not extend more than 10 feet from outside the building to 6 inches above the finished floor and contain not more than one 90 degree bend. See Table 4601.6.

**SECTION 4606  
OPERATING PERMIT FEES**

**4606.1 Ammunition.** An operating fee of \$100 shall be assessed as follows: Reload Any Amount of Small Arms Ammunition for Retail Sales \$100. Reload Any Amount of Military, Specialty, or Custom Ammunition \$100. Store Any Amount of Military, Specialty or Custom Ammunition \$100.

**Exception:** Storage in Group R-3 occupancies of smokeless propellant, black powder and small arms primers for personal use, not for resale and in accordance with Section 3306.

**4606.2 Amusement buildings.** A construction permit fee of \$500 shall be assessed for each special amusement building. The permit fee includes the plan review and inspection of the automatic sprinkler system and fire alarm system.

**4606.3 Batteries, stationary lead-acid.** An operating permit fee of \$100 is assessed to store, use or handle stationary lead-acid battery system having a liquid capacity of more than 100 gallons in a sprinklered building or 50 gallons in a nonsprinklered building.

**Valve-regulated lead-acid (VRLA).** A construction permit fee of \$100 is assessed to store, use or handle valve-regulated lead-acid (VRLA) battery systems.

**4606.4 Bonfires.** An operating permit is required to ignite and maintain a bonfire. The fee shall be \$50.

**4606.5 Blasting operations.** An operating permit is required to use explosive materials to conduct blasting operations.

Each site 30 days - the fee shall be \$225.

Each additional 30 days, or portion thereof - \$180.

**4606.6 Carnivals and fairs.** See Outdoor assembly events.

**4606.7 Combustible materials storage.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to store in any building or upon any premises in excess of 2,500 cubic feet (71 m<sup>3</sup>) gross volume of combustible empty packing cases, boxes, barrels or similar containers, rubber tires, rubber, cork or similar combustible material.

**4606.8 Commercial recycling operation.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to operate a commercial recycling plant.

**4606.9 Covered mall buildings.** An annual operating fee of \$420 shall be assessed to all shopping malls that utilize the mall area for exhibits and displays. The permit applies only to the exhibits and displays for community service projects or events sponsored by the mall or merchants. The annual operating permit is required to use a covered mall as a place of assembly.

Other trade shows, displays and exhibitions held in the mall shall require separate trade show or exhibition permits.

**4606.10 Cutting and welding.** See Section 4606.14 - Hot work operations.

**4606.11 Exhibits and trade shows.** An operating permit fee of \$150 shall be assessed to operate exhibits and trade shows under, based on aggregate area used up to 5,000 square feet the fee shall be \$150.00, greater than 5,000 square feet.

**Exception:** Exhibits less than 100 aggregate square feet.

**4606.12 Flammable and combustible liquids.** Operating permits are required in accordance with Table 4607.1.

**Exception:** The storage or use of paints, oils, varnishes or similar flammable mixtures when such liquids are stored for maintenance, painting or similar purposes for a period of not more than 30 days.

**4606.13 Hazardous materials.** Operating permits are required in accordance with Table 4607.1.

**4606.14 Hot work operations.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed for hot work. Hot work includes, but not limited to:

1. Public exhibitions and demonstrations where hot work is conducted.
2. Use of portable hot work equipment inside a structure.

**Exception:** Work that is conducted under a construction permit.

3. Fixed-site hot work equipment such as welding booths.
4. Hot work conducted within a hazardous fire area.
5. Application of roof coverings with the use of an open-flame device.

**4606.14.1 Hot Work Program.** When approved, the fire code official shall issue a permit to carry out a Hot Work Program. An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed for this program, which allows approved personnel to regulate their facility's hot work operations.

**4606.15 Open burning.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed for the kindling or maintaining of an open fire or a

fire on any public street, alley, road, or other public or private ground.

**Exception:** Recreational fires.

**4606.16 Open flames and candles.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to use open flames or flame-producing devices in connection with assembly areas, dining areas of restaurants or drinking establishments.

**4606.17 Open flame roasting operations.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to conduct a commercial open-flame roasting operation.

**4606.18 Outdoor assembly event.** An operating permit fee of \$300 shall be assessed to operate an outdoor assembly event.

**4606.19 Outdoor combustible materials storage.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed for outside storage of combustible materials or recyclables.

**4606.20 Places of assembly.** An operating permit fee of \$100 shall be assessed to operate a place of assembly.

**4606.21 Pyrotechnic special effects material.** An operating permit is required for use and handling of pyrotechnic special effects material. The fees shall be assessed as follows:

- Each new location – \$500
- Repeat locations, previously approved – \$250
- Each additional display – \$180

**4606.22 Refrigeration equipment.** An operating permit fee of \$1250 is assessed to operate an anhydrous ammonia mechanical refrigeration unit or system that contains more than 30 pounds of anhydrous ammonia regulated by Chapter 6.

**4606.23 Pyrotechnics theatrical displays.** An operating permit is required to conduct theatrical performances. The fees shall be assessed as follows:

- Each new location – \$500
- Repeat locations, previously approved – \$250
- Each additional display – \$180

**4606.24 Trade shows and exhibitions.** An operating permit fee of \$150 shall be assessed for trade shows and exhibitions up to 5,000 square feet (aggregate area used), and \$300 if greater than 5,000 square feet.

**4606.25 Used or waste tires and tire byproducts.** An operating permit fee of \$100 is assessed to establish, conduct or maintain storage of 100 or more used or waste tires and tire byproducts that exceeds 2,500 cubic feet (71 m<sup>3</sup>) of total volume of scrap tires in an open area or portion thereof outdoors and for indoor storage of tires and tire byproducts.

**4606.26 Vehicle display liquid- or gas-fueled vehicles or equipment in assembly buildings.** An operating fee of \$100 shall be assessed to display liquid- or gas-fueled vehicles or equipment in assembly occupancies, and the display of automobiles in Group M and Covered Mall Buildings.

**Exception:** Auto dealerships.

**4606.27 Waste handling.** An operating fee of \$100 shall be assessed to operate commercial recycling and waste material-handling facilities.

**4606.28 Water supply tests on private hydrants.** An operating fee of \$300 shall be assessed for hydrant flow tests performed on private hydrants by the property owner or his representative to be used in the design of fire protection systems shall be witnessed by the Phoenix Fire Department.

### SECTION 4607 ASSESSMENT FEES

**4607.1 Hazardous material assessment fees.** Shall be in accordance with Table 4607.1.

**Exemptions:** The following hazardous materials, occupancies or uses are exempt from the assessment fee described in Section 4607.1. Exemption from the assessment fee does not waive any of the applicable requirements contained or adopted in the *Phoenix Fire Code*.

1. Radioactive materials regulated in accordance with A.R.S. Title 30, Chapter 4.
2. Carbon dioxide in low pressure containers less than 500 gallons water capacity and any carbon dioxide fire extinguishing system.
3. Any material used or stored for noncommercial purposes at a single-family residence.
4. Any material contained in a transportation vehicle when the vehicle is not being used for permanent storage.
5. Small quantity and large quantity hazardous waste generators who are in compliance with all applicable regulations in C.F.R. Part 262 and Arizona Administrative Code R-18-8-262.
6. Medical gas systems storing and using less than 1,000 cubic feet (NTP) of United States Pharmacopoeia grade oxygen or nitrous oxide.
7. Dry cleaning plants storing or using nonflammable or noncombustible liquids.
8. Underground storage tanks containing flammable or combustible liquids.
9. Aboveground storage tanks containing flammable or combustible liquids stored in listed below-grade vaults that comply with this code.
10. Underground storage containers containing liquefied petroleum gases.
11. LP-gas cylinder exchange cabinets.
12. A permit is not required for a maximum of 200 pounds of solid or 20 gallons of liquid Class 3 oxidizers when such materials are necessary for maintenance purposes, operation or sanitation of equipment.

### SECTION 4608 CERTIFICATE FEES

**4608.1 Business certificate.** A certificate fee of \$100 shall be assessed of any entity that installs, modifies, alters, adds to, tests, repairs and services any fire alarm system, sprinkler system, standpipe system, fire main, fire pump or any other fire-

extinguishing or detection system, device or appliance shall obtain a business certificate. A business certificate is required for companies that install, modify, repair or test fire protection equipment within the jurisdiction. Duplicate cards shall be \$50.

**Exception:** Testing, repair or servicing of fire-protection equipment, devices or appliances may be conducted by facility employees or employees of the Business Certificate holder, both of whom are required to have a valid Certificate of Fitness.

**4608.2 Certificate of fitness.** A certificate fee of \$100 shall be assessed prior to servicing portable fire extinguishers, using explosive materials, or conducting pyrotechnic outdoor fireworks, theatrical or special effects displays. See Section 105.3.3.

**4608.3 Competent party certificate.** A certificate fee of \$100 shall be assessed for a competent party certificate. The competent party shall remain on-site and carry the card during installation, modifications, maintenance and testing performed on fire protection systems.

If the competent party ends their employment with the Business Certificate holder the card shall be surrendered to the Fire Department and a new card showing the new employer shall be obtained. The fee shall be \$50.

### SECTION 4609 ANNUAL INSPECTION FEES

**4609.1 Annual facility inspections permit:** An operational permit shall be required for a thorough fire inspection which is conducted annually, and complies with the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) requirements. This includes adult care, hospitals and congregate living facilities. The fee schedule is based on the number of licensed beds as determined by ADHS.

**Note:** The annual inspection fee includes consulting services for fire and life safety concerns and any maintenance issues. The annual fee does not include permit fees for new construction, remodeling or Annual Facility Permit (AFP) projects, or hazardous materials assessment fees.
